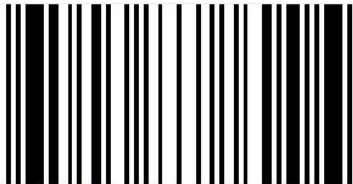

Each party shall be entitled to have the children for two non-consecutive weeks of vacation. Vacation shall not be scheduled so as to take a weekend from the other party.

Holiday parenting time takes precedence over regular time with the parties.

** Shared residency shall mean equal or nearly equal blocks of time **and** equal or nearly equal sharing of direct expenses of the child/children.

5. That in the event of a dispute between the parties concerning residency of the child/children, the matter will be referred to mediation before it can be brought before the Court.
6. That this proposed parenting plan is in the best interest of the minor child/children and shall remain in effect until further order of the Court.
